MUSICAL EDUCATION

Born the 10 February 1961 in Berchidda, in the Italian region of Sardinia. He began to study his instrument at the age of 11 in the "Bernardo de Muro" Musical Band of Berchidda. After various experiences in pop music he discovers jazz in 1980 starting his professional activity in 1982, at first attending the "Seminari Senesi" and then recording for RAI-RadioTelevisione Italiana under the direction of Bruno Tommaso. He gets a degree as Perito Elettrotecnico (i.e. electricity technician) in Sassari, then in 1984 he graduates in Trumpet at the Conservatory of Cagliari with the maestro Enzo Morandini and later he attends the faculty of "DAMS - music section" at the University of Bologna. His activities counts over 400 recordings and more than 3.500 concerts all over the world. He lives between Bologna, Paris and Sardinia. The French Jazzman assigned to the Cd "Night on the City" the Award "Choc" in 1995 and in 1998 to the Cd "Tempo" of the band "Palatino".

The record "Angel" in 1998 received the Award of the French magazine "Télérama", and the Paolo Fresu "Angel Quartet" has been awarded at the Olympia of Paris.

The Cd "Condaghes" by the Trio Paolo Fresu-Erik Marchand-Jacques Pellen won the "Choc" by the magazine "Le Monde de la Musique" in 1998 as well as the Cd "Sonos 'e Memoria" in 2001, and in 2002 the Cd "Heartland" took the nomination as "Choc" record by Jazzman (France).

In 2000 the Spanish magazine "Cuadernos de Jazz" inserted Paolo Fresu between the ten principal protagonists of jazz of the Nineties, like in 2002 for the magazine Jazzman. In March of 2004 the same magazine inserted the Cd "Night on the City" in the list of the 100 Cd of the twentieth century.
