MUSICAL EDUCATION

Born the 10 February 1961 in Berchidda, Sardinia.

He began to study his instrument at the age of 11 in the rows of "Bernardo de Muro" Musical Band of his native village. After various experiences in pop music territories he discovers jazz in 1980 starting his professional activity in 1982, attending first at "Seminari" in Siena and then recording for RAI (Italian Radio Television) under the direction of Bruno Tommaso.

He graduates in Trumpet at the Conservatory of Cagliari under the guide of Maestro Enzo Morandini and later attends the faculty of "DAMS - music section" by Bologna' University.

His activities count over 400 recordings and more than 4.000 concerts.

He lives between Bologna, Paris and Sardinia.

RECOGNITION OF SPECIALIZED MAGAZINES

Since the mid-eighties he has always been present at the top of the <Top Jazz> rankings of the most important Italian jazz magazine "Musica Jazz" and on the critics and public pool of "JazzIt" and in other Italian and international referendum/pool, both as "best musician" and as "group leader" or with his own record productions. For this last he has been nominated several times in the <JazzIt Award> as best artistic director of Italian festival in relation to his creature "Time in Jazz".

Many reports and acknowledgments of specialized magazines abroad for his record productions.

The American "Cadence" has defined <Ostinato> one of the most important discs of 1986.

The French "Jazzman" has assigned to the Cd <Night on the City> the <Choc> award in 1995 and 1998 to the Cd <Tempo> of the <Palatino> group.

The album <Angel> in 1998 received the award of the French magazine <Télérama>, and Paolo Fresu <Angel Quartet> was awarded at the Olympia in Paris.

The Cd <Condaghes> of the Trio Paolo Fresu-Erik Marchand-Jacques Pellen won the <Choc> magazine <Le Monde de la Musique> in 1998 and the CD <Sonos' e Memoria> in 2001, while in 2002 the CD <Heartland > has the record as a <Choc> record by Jazzman (France).

In 2000, the Spanish magazine <Cuadernos de Jazz> included Paolo Fresu as one of the ten main protagonists of jazz in the 90's; the same conclusion reached in 2002 on "Jazzman" magazine. In March 2004, the same magazine includes the CD <Night on the City> in the best 100 CD titles of the twentieth century.

In 2012 the CD <Alma> is <Choc> for the French magazines Jazz Magazine and Jazz News and in 2013 won the <Global Music Award / Best of show Award> in the United States and the CD <Desertico> results in the <Bluefat's Best of 2013 list> while the specialized magazine <JazzIt> dedicates a special 50-page magazine in 2013. In 2024, the record <Legacy> is <Choc> for Jazz Magazine.

TEACHING

In the early Eighties he taught Musical Education at the Scuole Medie Statali (colleges) of the cities Mores, Ittireddu, Alà dei Sardi, Buddusò, Bono, Bottida and Illorai.

Since 1985 he teaches at the "Seminari Internazionali" of "Siena jazz".

From 1989 to 2013 he is director and teacher at the "Nuoro Jazz Workshops".

From 1993 to 1995 he taught at the "Corsi di specializzazione C.E.E." of "Siena jazz".

From 1987 to 1991 he taught at the courses of the "Jazz University" of Terni.

From 1988 to 1992 he taught at the courses "CPM" of "Siena jazz".

From 1990 to 1995 he taught at the "Corsi di San Lazzaro di Savena".

From 1993 to 1994 he taught at the "Corsi Thelonious Monk" of Vicenza.

In 2009 is teacher of "high specialized school" by "Siena Jazz".

Of 2007 <A solo> and <Le Fresiadi> for the 20th edition of the Time in Jazz Festival, of 2008 <Runnin'> at the Auditorium Parco della Musica in Rome and of 2009 the baroque production with the Italian Virtuosi for the Suoni delle Dolomiti, the project <Let's get found Chet Baker> shared together with pianist Mauro Grossi and <Crittograph> with arrangements by Giulio Libano. From 2009 to 2011 he directed the Bergamo International Jazz Festival.

From 2010 he's co-producer and art-director of "Nidi di note", dedicated to children musical education in Bologna.

In 2014 coordinates the international project dedicated to "La Grande Guerra" (1st World war) under the direction of the Presidency of Italian Minister Council. Always in 2014, he directs the help project "Sardegna chi ama" and the European competition "EU.MusicMatch 2.0" in Alghero.

From 2015 to 2019 he has directed the <FestAmbienteSud> festival in Monte Sant'Angelo in the Gargano area

From 2015 to 2019 he directs the festival <Italian jazz for the Earthquake Lands>.

From 2015 to 2019 he directs together with Sonia Peana the educational project <Notelementari> for primary schools.

From 2017 to 2020 he directs the international festival <JazzAlguer> in the city of Alghero.

In 2022 he directs the International Archaeology Festival "The Island of the Giants" of the Mont'e Prama Foundation in Cabras, Sardinia.

Since 2022, he has directed the <Insulae Lab> project for Time in Jazz Association.

In 2024 he co-directs the IJVAS International Jazz Day with Gegè Telesforo.

PLACES AND FESTIVALS

He played at the most important Italian and foreign Festivals in all the continents and in top-level locations like Olympia and the Salle Pleyel of Paris, "Blue Note" of New York and Milano or in Konzerthall of Vienna and in top-level contexts like Palagalileo of Venezia during the "Mostra Internazionale del Cinema", the Cinema Festival of Cannes (2003) and, again in Venezia, the Biennale Musica (2003) directed by Uri Caine.

In 2004 he received from Auditorium di Roma /Parco della Musica a personal "focus" on his music productions, collaborations and ensembles.

In 2005 participated as a soloist with Orchestra Sinfonica Toscanini to the "2nd August" commemorative concert in Bologna.

Incredibly successfully were, in January 2006 in the great Santa Cecilia' Room of Auditorium/Parco della Musica in Rome, the world premiere of his "solo" concert and – in Lyon (France) – a long "Carte Blanche" (a special program as resident artist) dedicated to his music and some of his most important projects, in Lyon (France) and in Bologna (Italy) (2007).

In 2010 he played at the Expo in Shanghai and he played dates in Usa with guitarist Ralph Towner. In 2011 a "Carte Blanche" in Orvieto for Umbria Jazz Winter and in 2012 again "Carte Blanche" for MiTo and Teatro Valli in Reggio Emilia and, in 2015, another one for Teatro dell'Elfo di Milano.

Always in 2015, collaborates with Orchestra del Mediterraneo for a special version of "Norma" by Vincenzo Bellini, re-wrote by Paolo Silvestri, with Orchestra del Teatro di Messina and with Orchestra da Camera di Perugia. Moreover, plays in a very special live concert during a flight for Meridiana air-company. In 2016 he plays in a new "carte blanche" project by Musée des confluences of Lyon (France). In 2019, the project "Two for Tree" was born, with concerts on ancient trees in duo with Daniele di Bonaventura and with the Perugia Chamber Orchestra.

In 2022 and 2023 he plays in the Basilica of Santa Maria Novella and performs "Altissima Luce" and "Back to Bach - Special Edition" in Santa Maria del Fiore/Duomo in Florence.

From 2013 to 2018 he is in the board of Midj (Association of Italian jazz musicians) and actively collaborates with the I-Jazz Association for the development of Italian jazz in dialogue with the MiBac and the Siae.
